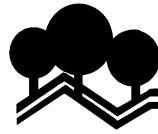

# Life as a Houseplant: Oranges

A Calamondin Orange is a dwarf shrub with shiny green leathery leaves, which bears fragrant white star-shaped flowers followed by bright orange fruit 1- 1.5" in diameter. Flowers and fruit are often present at the same time.

The fruit, though edible, is very bitter. It will remain on the tree for months after ripening making a colourful accent for a bright sunny room. It is a slow grower, reaching about 1 meter or a little better at maturity.

Citrus plants are not difficult to care for. They should be potted in standard potting mix with good drainage and will need to be re-potted when they become root-bound about every 2 years.

They need 4 hours of direct sun daily so a bright south or west window is ideal. Artificial lighting may also be used. They will tend to grow towards the light source, so should be turned frequently. Their preferred temperature is 18-24°C.

As far as watering requirements, citrus plants like to be kept evenly moist. Allow the soil surface to dry between watering. To maintain their preferred acidity, add 1 tsp. white vinegar to 1 gallon of water.

Fertilize every two weeks in spring and summer when plants are actively growing using a balanced liquid fertilizer mixed according to directions.

Plants may be pruned in spring to keep them small or improve their shape. Cut at an angle just above a leaf node (where a leaf attaches to the stem). Pruning back long branches will encourage bushier growth with new branches emerging from just below the cut.
