

The Best Perennials for Dried Flowers

Flowers for drying should be picked in mid morning after the dew has dried from their petals and leaves, and place them in a location out of direct sunlight to prevent fading. Some of the best varieties for drying are as follows.

The Best Perennials for Ground Covers

A groundcover is a massed group of a single type of plant that covers the ground with thick foliage. These plants are low-growing and tough. They may provide a solution for areas where little else will grow. Many gardeners like groundcovers simply because they require so little maintenance! Groundcovers spread quickly, reduce water loss and soil erosion on slopes, and retard the spread of weeds. (An asterisk (*) indicates plants best suited to shady areas.

The Best Perennials with Interesting Foliage

Thin not only of flowers when planning your garden, but also of foliage. Include perennials with various leaf shapes, colors, sizes and textures to both unify and diversify the overall effect of your garden. Many of those perennials also have glorious flowers, but even when they are not blooming their foliage enhances the flowers of other plants. Plants marked with an asterisk (*) area suited to shady areas.

The Best Perennials For Cut Flowers

Almost all perennials can be used for cut flowers, but the best ones have showy blooms, strong stems and last as long as two weeks in a vase.

Make the most of fragrant flowers by planting them along a walkway, near the back deck, close to a doorway, or under a window that is often open. Perennials with fragrant foliage should be planted where you will brush them as you pass by, releasing the aroma of their leaves.
